Firebirds to Gather in Galveston

It's difficult for one to believe that, at the next reunion, ten years will have passed since the Firebirds first flocked to Biloxi in 1998. Counting the first Firebird Association reunions held in Abilene during 1982, 1983, and 1984, there will have been a total of nine reunions including the upcoming 2008 gathering.

Those that attended the Branson reunion during 2006 will recall that the reunion sites proposed at the general membership meeting were Wright-Patterson, Nashville, and Abilene. So, how did Galveston become the site for the next Firebird gathering? "It's elementary, my dear Watson." Well, perhaps not too elementary after all.

According to the minutes from the Branson reunion members interested in these particular sites were to research each location and send the results to the planning committee. Months passed and no information was presented.

As the decision date grew near, Firebird Chuck Lavoie traveled to the Biloxi area and visited twenty -six different hotel properties. And, he contacted several caterers and collected their menus. Only one hotel he found would meet the Firebird requirements.

A week or two later, the

reunion planning commit tee met in Bossier City to discuss the next reunion and to determine the suitability of Shreveport/ Bossier as a reunion site. No hotel met the Association's hospitality room requirement.

Bylaws Revision

As required by Association bylaws, the following proposed revisions will be considered and voted upon at the Galveston general membership meeting.

Section 1: ORGANIZATION

The Board of Directors shall consist of fifteen members. In addition to the Officers of the Firebird Association, which include the President. Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Historian, and Newsletter Editor. the Board of Directors shall include the last three Immediate Past Presidents, and six (6) Directors at Large. All members of the Board should reflect the general make-up of the active membership, and each shall have one vote. The Executive Board shall include, but not be limited to, the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Historian, and Newsletter Editor.

Section 4: ELECTION AND TERM.

Terms of office for Firebird Association Officers end and begin on the first (1st) day of the month following the biennial meeting: President. Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Historian, and Newsletter Editor. Association officers shall be elected by the membership at the biennial general meeting of the Association, according to procedures determined by the Board of Directors, for a term of two years. The Vice President shall succeed the President when the President's term of office expires--a limit of two terms--unless otherwise specified by a quorum vote of the Board of Directors. The Board Members at Large shall be elected for a term of four (4) years on a rotating basis. Three (3) At Large Board Members are to be elected each election year.

Section 7: SPECIAL/ EMERGENCY MEET-INGS.

Special/emergency meetings may be called by the President provided written notice is sent to each member of the Board of Directors at least seven days in advance. If necessary to secure a quorum at such meetings, absent members of the Board of Directors may fully participate by telephone conference call. Such participation shall constitute attendance in person.

In 1982, former members of the 17th TCS and 17th TAS officially organized the Firebird Association.

The stated purpose of the Association is to commemorate the aviation history of the 17th Troop Carrier Squadron and the 17th Tactical Airlift Squadron of the United States Air Force, its predecessor and missionsuccessor organizations, and of all military units who have flown skiequipped versions of the C-130 aircraft within any of the Armed Forces of the United States of America. And, provide social and recreational activities for, and to maintain fraternal contacts between, its members.

Eligibility for membership is open to any and all persons who served on active duty in the United States Air Force with the 17th Troop Carrier Squadron and/or the 17th Tactical Airlift Squadron; any and all persons who served with any of the predecessor or mission-successor organizations of the 17th Troop Carrier Squadron and/or the 17th Tactical Airlift Squadron, including but not limited to the 61st Troop Carrier Squadron, the 109th Tactical Airlift Group/Wing, or the 517th Airlift Squadron; any and all persons who served with United States Navy Antarctic Development Squadron Six (VXE-6); Any and all persons who, while on active or active-reserve duty with the United States Air Force or the United States Navy, have ever flown as a crew member on a skiequipped model of the C-130 aircraft; Any and all persons who have supported the mission(s) of the ski-equipped C-130 aircraft flown by any active duty, reserve or National Guard unit of the Armed Forces of the United States, such as but not limited to, operational

control, aircraft maintenance, aerial port, combat control team and industry technical representative; The spouses, widows. widowers and children of any of the above; and Upon nomination for membership by any active Firebird and acceptance by a majority vote of the Board of Directors, any other person, not otherwise qualified, who has an interest in this association and supports the purposes for which it is organized.

Historian's Homily

In less than four months the ninth Firebird Association reunion to be held in the last twenty-six years will become a reality. At the first Biloxi reunion the Firebird Association Board of Directors voted to hold a reunion every even year. The intent is for this to become a tradition, but the continuation of any reunion depends upon the active participation of current and prospective members.

In 1998, 270 members attended, and this year the *mission* is to fill all120 rooms at the Galveston LaQuinta Inn and Suites with a Firebird Association member. Another excellent reunion is being built. Standard rooms at the LaQuinta have been reserved at a special rate of \$70.00 per night plus tax. If you've been thinking of attending, please make tour room reservations soon. Around the first of March, all unreserved rooms must be returned to the hotel for rent at their regular rates, which are usually over \$100.00 per night.

If you've never attended a Firebird Association reunion, let this be your first. It promises to be "an affair to remember." If you came to the last gathering, consider visiting withhold friends once again. I'm sure that there will be many new faces in attendance this year. Your "being there" will make the reunion complete for someone else. This kind of "networking" will make this reunion a success, and insure that there will be many future reunions to attend.

Normal room rates are over \$100 per night during April, but General Manager Willis Gandhi of the La Quinta Inn and Suites is setting up a special price of \$70.00 per night for all "standard rooms," which are not a suite. Two-room suites will be priced at \$109 per night. This special rate does not include state and local taxes of approximately fifteen percent (15%).

Be sure to inform the reservations clerk that you want the special Firebird Association room rate--Group Code: Firebird Reunion

All rooms have been re-

served for the Firebirds at this price; first come, first served. Additional nights are subject to availabilityjust ask when registering.

According to the hotel, the special group rates apply before and after the reunion dates. Therefore, please make reservations at your earliest opportunity. Note that three different Firebird Association members, and their wives, have traveled to Galveston to check this property and have recommended it for our reunion.

A consideration in choosing this property was the hospitality room, and hotel approval for the Association to serve its own beverages and snacks.

The La Quinta Inn & Suites is located just three miles from the center of the island city of Galveston. The hotel has a sparkling outdoor Swimming Pool and a relaxing Hot Tub, plus a Fitness Center for use at one's leisure. Every morning, guests may enjoy a tasty complimentary Continental Breakfast served up by the courteous staff in the eating area off of the hotel lobby.

The hotel manager has promised to give the Association all available space in the hotel for hospitality purposes if most of the rooms are reserved by Firebird Association members. You must have a fishing license which is \$10.00 for TX residents and \$15.00 for non-residents. Most Wal-Mart stores sell fishing licenses. Begin around 8:30AM and finish around 3:00PM. Plan to car-pool, the course is about a 25/30 minute drive. Take a warm jacket.

REUNION ACTIVITIES (Cont.)

POSIBSIBLE STATIC DISPLAY:

We are still trying for a static display from the 109th NYANG TCW. At this point prospects do not look good, Washington says "NO" so we are trying a different approach. Plans for Tuesday afternoon can not be finalized until the display matter is resolved. Regardless, we have tours planned for both The Lonestar Flight Museum and Moody Gardens. Should we get the display, it will be at the museum. The two facilities are located with adjoining parking lots and tram-transport between the two. This part of the plan has been agreed on we're just not certain of the exact times. Moody Gardens has 3 main areas to tour. They are worth the \$5.00 charge. That is \$5.00 for each attraction, they have an aquarium that is world class and a rain forest and a I-MAX theater. By April we will have a show program for the I-MAX.

BANQUET:

Moody Gardens will shut down entry to the public at 4:30PM but remains open until all tours have been completed, about 5:30PM. Complete touring facilities are then closed and only the restaurant facility is open for reserved parties such as ours. This facility has a beautiful open view of Offat Bayou and West Bay. There is seating at a outside veranda, weather permitting. The meal is full buffet with a pretty fabulous menu. You can pick one up at the reunion registration desk. The doors open at 6:00PM with a cash bar. Cost is \$21.00 per person we have live music from 6:00PM to 10:00PM for your listening pleasure. Attire for the evening is Dress/Casual.

TRAVEL INFORMATION

ATTENTION: There are two LaQuinta Hotels on Galveston Island. You will be going to the one on the west end, near the airport, 8710 Seawall Blvd.

AIR LINES: No commercial air lines fly into Galveston. Arrivals must fly into Houston, either Bush International or Hobby International. If you plan to rent a car and you are arriving at Bush International, then you will have to drive through downtown Houston. Check the Houston Travel section. Hobby is about thirty miles closer to Galveston and is much easier to travel from.

TRAVEL INFORMATION (cont)

Galveston Limousine Service has an hourly pick up and delivery to both airports. You must make your own arrangements for this service. The round trip cost from Bush is \$60.00, from Hobby is \$50.00. Be sure to tell the reservation clerk that you are a Firebird for a \$5.00 discount. Phone 409-740-5466 or 800-640-4826.

DRESS: Bring warm cloths. Galveston is open to the Gulf of Mexico and even with her mild temperatures, the almost constant sea-breeze can leave you with a chill.

HOUSTON TRAVEL HINTS:

Houston has two major complete loops, the inner loop is 610, the outer loop is Beltway 8.

NOTE—Beltway 8 and Sam Houston Parkway run concurrently. Parts of the Sam Houston Parkway are toll areas, some are not. Eventually the total parkway will be tolls, but for now it is still a work-in-progress. If you stay on the ground level of Beltway 8 there are no tolls, but you have traffic lights and cross streets. Tolls run between 25 cents to \$1.25, and you can get change by going thru a booth in a lane with a blue overhead sign.

If you are driving thru Houston from the west on I-10 and you would like to miss a lot of construction delays, (sometimes an hour or more) and also miss downtown altogether, take State Hwy 6 to the south. Check a map. It is several-many miles further and has some local traffic, some traffic lights, but it is a good road. 'Beats bumper to bumper for 15 miles. I live in this area and it almost never lets up.

If you prefer to travel I-10 thru downtown then read carefully. After you have crossed under Beltway 8/ SamHou Pkwy, stay in one of the two left lanes. After you cross under Loop 610 remain in one of the two left lanes. Stay in the 2nd from the left as much as possible because eventually that lane feeds into I-45 south. Once you've made the feed, you will be on I-45 South. Move into the 2nd from the right lane ASAP. Go about 1 1/2 miles and you will see a large overhead sign that says "GALVESTON". This is over the right lane, don't panic, both lanes feed into the I-45 South elevated thru downtown. Important— STAY IN THE MIDDLE....both the right and left lanes exit and without much warning. Once you leave the elevated portion, you are on I-45 South. From here it is a nice multi-lane freeway all the way to Galveston, about 45 minutes.

TRAVEL INFORMATION (cont)

IMPORTANT: I-45 has a street name, "The Gulf Freeway". They are the same.

If you are driving from the east on I-10, the best way is I-10 to Beltway 8/ Sam Houston Pkwy, go south on Beltway 8 to I-45, then go south on I-45 to Galveston. It's about 30 minutes travel time.

If you are traveling from the east and you would like to meander thru the country-side, take state hwy 124 south at Winnie TX. 124 goes south to the beach road state hwy 87. Go west on hwy 87 to the Bolivar Ferry. The ferry is a free ride across to Galveston Island. "Draw Back"....these are not large boats and the wait can be as long as an hour, but usually is only about 15 min.. When exiting the ferry, stay on Hwy 87 unit you reach Seawall Blvd. (only about a mile). Go west or right on Seawall for about 5 or 6 miles to the hotel.

Traveling from the N/E on Hwy 59, stay on Hwy 59 around to the south side of the downtown area and intersect with I-45, go south on I-45, about 45 minutes from Galveston.

Coming from the north on I-45, when you are going around downtown, stay in the next to the right lane and you will be OK.

Coming in from the N/W on Hwy 290 take Loop 610 to the east or left all the way around to the south side of Houston and go south on I-45. You are about 40 minutes away.

AIRPORT ARRIVALS-RENTING CARS:

Bush International Airport or HIA, Exit the airport on JFK Blvd to Beltway 8, go west or right on Beltway 8 to I-45 and follow the instructions already given for "Coming from the North on I-45".

Hobby Airport..... Exit the airport on Airport road, go south or right to I-45, go south or right on I-45. You are about 40 minutes from Galveston.
